
Prayer and Fasting Guide 2025

Intentional – "an action performed with awareness; done deliberately, consciously, on purpose."

January 6th – 26th

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What does Jesus say about fasting?

"When you fast, stop looking sad like hypocrites. They put on sad faces to make it obvious that they're fasting. I can guarantee this truth: That will be their only reward. When you fast, wash your face and comb your hair. Then your fasting won't be obvious. Instead, it will be obvious to your Father who is with you in private. Your Father sees what you do in private. He will reward you. (Matthew 6:16-18 GW)

Why do we do 21 days of fasting and prayer each year at River of Life?

Daniel 10:1-3 In the third year of Cyrus king of Persia a word was revealed to Daniel, who was named Belteshazzar. And the word was true, and it was a great conflict. And he understood the word and had understanding of the vision. 2 In those days I, Daniel, was mourning for three weeks. 3 I ate no delicacies, no meat or wine entered my mouth, nor did I anoint myself at all, for the full three weeks.

Daniel was seeking the Lord on behalf of God's people and His future plans for them. We also are seeking for God's blessing and guidance for our church this year.

Daniel broke away from his normal routine of living in order to set himself apart to focus on really seeking God. We as River of Life Church are doing the same.

Daniel was heard because of his humble and intense desire to know God's will and plans for His people. **We desire the same.**

Daniel 10:12 - Then he said to me, "Fear not, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart to understand and humbled yourself before your God, your words have been heard, and I have come because of your words.

It is very possible Daniel would have done a normal fast (no food, just water) but perhaps due his duties in the kingdom he needed to eat enough to keep his strength up in order to perform his everyday responsibilities. So, this is basically the definition of what many refer to as **the Daniel Fast**.

In our culture today we definitely have duties and responsibilities to perform yet we also want to seek God intently. It is for this reason that our church provides this type of fast each year so that together we can seek the Lord for His will in order to discover His plans and purposes for us.

People also have fasted what Daniel referred to as "**delicacies**" which in our culture would probably be fried food, meat, sweets, soft drinks, etc. Test have proven that the average American consumes and assimilates 4 pounds of chemical preservatives, coloring, stabilizers, flavorings, and other additives each year.

People have also been known to fast various forms of media. If there is anything that has a greater stronghold on your life than God, it is probably a good indication you need to fast it in order to keep it from dominating your life.

So, however the Holy Spirit leads you, remember this is between you and God. The thing to remember is that if it doesn't mean anything to you, it will not mean anything to God.

I would encourage you to read "What is fasting?" in this booklet on pages 23-24 for more information about actual fasting and its purposes and blessings. Also, a great book on fasting is "Fasting" by Jentezen Franklin.

Your WHEN, WHERE, WHAT, and WHY for This Year's Fast

In preparing yourself for this year's fast, ask the basic questions, when, where, what and why.

- When will be your time to get alone in prayer?
- Where will you go to have the least number of distractions in your prayer time?
- What will you be fasting? What's my reading plan going to be or listening to (audio Bible) for those who aren't big readers?
- Why will you be fasting?
 - (In this case we as a church are fasting in order to be intentional as we seek God's will for this coming year and to have maximum impact through our church to this world for 2025! So that's our why as part of ROL, but I'm sure you have some personal reasons to pray and fast about as well. Include those in the "why?"

King David said, "I will not offer God anything that costs me nothing."

Praying For Those Who Need God

2 Peter 3:9 (NKJV) The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.

1. Ask the Father to draw them to Jesus.

No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them... John 6:44

Think about the people you know who are far from God. Let your heart be open to God and anyone He may bring to your mind. It may help to write down their names as you focus on praying for them.

PRAYER: "Father, I pray for the people around me (list specific names), that you would supernaturally draw their hearts to you. Send your Holy Spirit to convict them and give them the desire to give their lives to You. Open their ears to hear your voice."

2. Bind the spirits that blind their minds.

The truth can be right in front of some people, and they still can't see it because something is in the way blocking their view of God.

2 Corinthians 4:3-4 (NIV) And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. [4] **The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel** that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

We can pray against whatever is in their way so that they can see the light of God. We can pray that they would see the truth without any obstacles or distractions interfering.

PRAYER: "Father, I bind the evil spirits that are blinding the minds of the people around me. In the name of Jesus, I pray that they would be able to see clearly, to recognize who You are, and to give their hearts to You. Remove all hindrances the enemy would use to distract them from Your truth. Open their eyes, Lord, that they might see You."

3. Pray that they will recognize that nothing of this world will fulfill them like God can.

There is a hole inside of every person that only God can fill.

Ecclesiastes 2:10-11 (NIV) I denied myself nothing my eyes desired; I refused my heart no pleasure. My heart took delight in all my labor, and this was the reward for all my toil. [11] Yet when I surveyed all that my hands had done and what I had toiled to achieve, everything was meaningless, a chasing after the wind; nothing was gained under the sun.

PRAYER: "Father, I pray that people will come to the place in their life where they understand that the longings of their heart (innermost being) cannot be satisfied by what this world has to offer. Help them to recognize their longing for more in life is a spiritual thirst only you can quench. Please help them to see You are the only One who can fill the hole in their hearts."

4. Pray for believers to cross their paths.

We can pray for other Christians to influence the people around them positively. God's plan to reach people is worked through those who already know and love Him. Jesus asked us to pray for people to go into the world to be salt and light.

Matthew 9:37-38 (NIV) Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. [38] Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

As his "spiritual farmers," we should be attuned to opportunities to plant spiritual seeds in the lives of the people we encounter each day. We may have no idea who has already been praying for them and the impact our kind word, compassionate act, or loving attitude can have to draw someone to Christ.

PRAYER: "Father, I pray for the lost around me to meet believers who will influence them in a positive way. Lord, let my life shine in such a way that people want to know the God I serve. Allow others to see my genuine love and concern for them in all that I say and do. Let me be Your hands and feet to serve them and let them know just how much You love them."

What is Fasting?

Fasting is abstaining from food for a spiritual purpose. It helps to unclutter your spirit by getting your focus off the things of this world and making you more sensitive to God.

A fast is NOT a:

- form of punishment or penance
- forced tradition
- weight loss strategy
- way to manipulate God or other people

Why Fast?

- To strategically make space for God in our lives.
- To break routine and spend more time focusing on spiritual matters as
- opposed to the natural.
- For breakthrough in areas of our life and church that will make us more effective for Christ.

Different Types of Fasting

Normal Fast: No food, water only Modified Fast: No food; juices only

- Tips on Juice Fasting
- Drinking fruit juice will decrease your hunger pains and give you some natural sugar energy. The taste and lift will motivate and strengthen you to continue. The best juices are 100 % juices.
- Mix acidic juices (orange, tomato) with water for your stomach's sake.

Daniel Fast: Fruits, Vegetables, water

Prolonged Fast Tips

If you choose to do a full fast of 3 days or more where you are only drinking water here are some suggestions:

1. Prepare Yourself Physically

- Fasting requires reasonable precautions. Consult your physician first, especially if you take prescription medication. Some persons should never fast without professional supervision.
- Do not rush into your fast. Prepare your body. Eat smaller meals before starting. Avoid high-fat and sugary foods.
- Eat raw fruit and vegetables for two days before starting.

2. While You Fast

- Limit your activity.
- Exercise only moderately.
- Rest as much as your schedule will permit.
- Prepare yourself for temporary mental discomforts, such as impatience, crankiness, and anxiety.
- Expect some physical discomforts, especially if fasting more than a day.
- Withdrawal from caffeine and sugar may cause headaches. Physical annoyances may also include weakness, tiredness, or sleeplessness.
- When doing a longer fast the first two or three days are usually the hardest.
 As you continue to fast, you will likely experience a sense of well-being both
 physically and spiritually. However, should you feel hunger pains, increase
 your liquid intake.

3. End Your Fast Gradually

- This applies to fasting three or more days. Begin eating gradually. Do not
 eat solid foods immediately after your fast. Suddenly reintroducing solid
 food to your stomach and digestive tract will likely have negative, even
 dangerous consequences. Try several smaller meals or snacks each day. If
 you end your fast gradually, the beneficial physical and spiritual effects will
 result in continued good health.
- Break extended water fast with fruit such as melons of some kind.
- While continuing to drink fruit or vegetable juices, add the following:
 - o First day: Add a raw salad.
 - o Second day: Add baked or boiled potato, no butter or seasoning.
 - Third day: Add a steamed vegetable.
 - o Thereafter: Begin to reintroduce your normal diet.
- Gradually return to regular eating with several small snacks during the first few days. Start with a little soup and fresh fruits such as watermelon and cantaloupe.
- Advance to a few tablespoons of solid foods such as raw fruits and vegetables or a raw salad and baked potato.
- If you fail to make it through your first full fast, do not be discouraged. You
 may have tried to fast too long the first time out, or you may need to
 strengthen your understanding and resolve. As soon as possible, undertake
 another fast until you do succeed.
